

## **Upper School Mathematics Teacher 2020-2021 School Year**

The Episcopal School of Baton Rouge seeks an Upper School Mathematics teacher for the 2020-2021 academic year. The responsibilities of this position include teaching multiple levels of mathematics, ranging from Algebra I to Calculus. This faculty member will also have an advisory of Upper School students and will be expected to oversee extracurricular and after-school activities. This is a ten-month, full-time position.

### **Description of the School**

Episcopal is a college preparatory educational community of approximately 930 students in grades Pre-K through 12. Episcopal is known historically for its robust academic performance, attention to the spiritual lives of its students, and for offering a wide range of opportunities for student education and development. Opportunities to excel in academics, arts, athletics, service, and community leadership characterize the student experience.

### **Professional Requirements**

- A Bachelor's or Master's degree in mathematics or in secondary education with a mathematics concentration.
- Demonstrated experience working with children.
- Ability to help students develop procedural fluency and conceptual understanding.

A combination of the following would make for a strong candidate:

- Demonstrated experience in a school setting working with students in the classroom, advisory, and extracurricular activities, with a commitment to educating the whole child.
- Knowledge of independent schools.
- An appreciation and understanding of teenaged children
- Demonstrated classroom management skills.
- Strong organizational and time management skills.
- Experience with digital educational technology, including the TI-30 series and TI-84 series of graphing calculator.
- Willingness to collaborate with administrators and colleagues to evolve the Mathematics program as needed to best fit future student needs.

As a member of the Episcopal faculty, the Upper School Math Teacher will serve as a representative of the school at all times, upholding its mission both personally and professionally. Candidates must be self-motivated individuals with excellent communication skills and should have an eagerness to help each student achieve his or her full potential. A professional demeanor

is expected and the skill to develop strong relationships is a must. Being a person that self-identifies (and that others describe) as a “happy” person, an emotionally intelligent person, a person with natural “situational awareness,” a person who consistently strives to improve, a “forward-looking” person, and a person who “plays well with others,” are all characteristics of the successful candidate.

Episcopal will offer a competitive salary and good benefits for this position. Stephen Anderson, Math Department Chair, will be the point person for this process.
